DUNGARVAN BRENT GOOSE MAP

From Winter 2021, Waterford City and County Council supported by the Department of Housing, Heritage and Local Government and The Heritage Council will commence a study investigating the spatio-temporal usage of Dungarvan Harbour and, at a larger scale, the migration of Light-bellied Brent Geese through the usage of small GPS/GSM Ornitela tags. These units record positions at regular intervals (many times per day), are powered by the sun (the tags have solar panels) and send data from the birds to the research team at regular intervals using the GSM (mobile phone) network! The project is an initiative of the Dungarvan Eco Group and will commence in January 2022 when a trained specialist team will capture Brent Geese around Dungarvan and release 12 tagged birds equipped with their satellite tags. These birds and the untagged ones will also carry unique engraved colour-rings which mean we can follow them for many years visually. When the project launches we will post updates on the website blog and the movements and migration of these birds can be followed on this page. Ó Gheimhreadh 2021 ar aghaidh, cuirfí dhí Comhairle Cathrach agus Contae Phort Láirge, le tacaíocht ón Roinn Tithiochta, Rialtais Áitiúil agus Oidhreachta agus an Chomhairle Oidhreachta, tús le staidéar chun úsáid spásúl-ama Chuan Dhún Garbhán a fhiosrú agus, ag scála níos mó, imirce an Chadhain a fhiosrú, trí chlibeanna Ornitela GPS/GSM a úsáid. Déanann na haonaid seo láithreacha a thaifead go rialta (go minic i rith an lae), faigheann siad a gcuid cumhachta ón ngrian (tá painéil ghréine ar na clibeanna) agus cuireann siad sonraí ó na héin chuig an fhoireann taighde ar bhonn rialta, ag úsáid an lónra GSM do ghutháin phócal! Tá an tionscadal seo bunaithe ar thionscnamh de chuid Ghrianána Éiceolaíochta Dhún Garbhán agus tosnóidh sé i mí Eanáir 2022, nuair a ghabhfaidh foireann speisialtóirí oilté Cadhain thart thimpeall Dún Garbhán agus scaoilfidh siad 12 éan clibéálte, le clibeanna satailte orthu saor arís. Beidh fáinní daite greanta ar leith ar na héin seo agus ar na héin nach bhfuil clib orthu, rud a chiallaíonn go mbeimid in ann iad a leanúint ó amharc ar feadh roinnt mhaith blianta. Nuair a sheolfar an tionscadal, cuirfimid nuashonrúcháin ar an mblag ar an suíomh idirlion agus beifear in ann gluaiseachtaí agus imirce na n-éan seo a leanúint ar an leathanach seo. Le tacaíocht ón gComhairle Oidhreachta trí Scéim Deontais d'Oidhreachta Phobail agus ó Chiste an Phlean Gnáiomhaiochta Náisiúnta um Bithéagsúlacht de chuid an Rannóg Tithiochta, Rialtais Áitiúil agus Oidhreachta 2020.
